Part 5: Safety of batteries with aqueous electrolyte

National foreword

This British Standard is the UK implementation of EN IEC 60086-5:2021. It is identical to IEC 60086-5:2021. It supersedes BS EN 60086-5:2016, which is withdrawn.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted to Technical Committee CPL/35, Primary cells.

BSI, as a member of CENELEC, is obliged to publish EN IEC 60086-5:2021 as a British Standard. However, attention is drawn to the fact that during the development of this European Standard, the UK committee voted against its approval.

It is the belief of the UK committee that abuse testing of batteries with aqueous electrolyte should be more thorough and that the method described within this document is oversimplified. The UK committee advises users to simulate test conditions whereby one battery in a set of four connected in series parallel is reversed.
