Part 8: Fuse resistors with particular overcurrent protection

This British Standard is the UK implementation of EN IEC 60127-8:2018+A1:2024. It is identical to IEC 60127-8:2018, incorporating amendment 1:2024. It supersedes BS EN IEC 60127-8:2018, which will be withdrawn on 21 August 2027.

The start and finish of text introduced or altered by amendment is indicated in the text by tags. Tags indicating changes to IEC text carry the number of the IEC amendment. For example, text altered by IEC amendment 1 is indicated by A1 A1.
